

## **Netiquette Guide for**

Below are the guidelines for a more ethical and better-conducted project.

1.	Respect Diversity: Remember that participants come from different cultures. Be mindful and respectful of cultural differences.
2.	Be Kind and Courteous: Treat others as you would like to be treated. Use polite language and be considerate of others' feelings.
3.	Think Before You Post: Consider how your words might be interpreted. If in doubt, ask yourself if you'd say it in person.
4.	Use Clear Communication: Write in full, comprehensible sentences. Avoid excessive use of abbreviations or slang that might not be understood by all.
5.	Respect Privacy: Don't share personal information about yourself or others without permission.
6.	Give Credit: If you use someone else's ideas or materials, always give them credit.
7.	Use Appropriate Language: Avoid offensive language, insults, or any form of hate speech.
8.	Be Constructive: When giving feedback, be constructive and supportive. Focus on the idea, not the person.
9.	Stay On Topic: Keep discussions relevant to the project themes and activities.
10.	Report Concerns: If you see any form of cyberbullying or inappropriate behavior, report it to a teacher or project coordinator immediately.
11.	Be Patient: Remember that language barriers may exist. Give others time to respond and express themselves.

12.	Use Caps Lock Sparingly: Writing in ALL CAPS is considered shouting in online communication.
13.	Respect Time Zones: Be aware that project members may be in different time zones when scheduling meetings or expecting responses.
14.	Be Inclusive: Make an effort to involve all team members in discussions and activities.
15.	Learn from Mistakes: If you make a mistake, apologize sincerely and learn from it.
16.	Use Emojis Wisely: Emojis can help convey tone, but use them sparingly and appropriately.
17.	Disagree Respectfully: It's okay to disagree, but do so politely and with respect for others' viewpoints.
18.	Protect Confidentiality: Don't share private messages or information from the project without permission.
19.	Be Forgiving: Remember that textual communication can be easily misinterpreted. Give others the benefit of the doubt.
20.	Enjoy and Learn: Embrace this opportunity to connect with peers across cultures and learn from each other!
